Wetlands of Distinction The board of SWS Canada continues to work on the application for nominating the Hudson Bay Lowlands (HBL) for Wetland of Distinction status. This designation is awarded by the Society of Wetland Scientists to raise awareness, appreciation and knowledge of critical wetlands across the world. The HBL is a vast and ecologically sensitive complex of boreal peatlands that spans Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba. We are currently in discussion with First Nations communities who are connected with the HBL; their participation as partners is essential to the application. The SWS Canada chapter is hosting a symposium (The intent and implementation of wetland offsetting in the mitigation hierarchy) with invited speakers from Canada and the US confirmed:
